Every three minutes, somewhere in the world, a child is born with cleft lip and palate. In many countries, these children do not have access to treatment. Without treatment, they suffer from the consequences of their congenital malformation for the rest of their lives. They are excluded because of their appearance and forced to live on the fringes of society.

But a cleft lip and palate is more than an aesthetic problem. Due to the cleft in the lip and usually also the palate, the children cannot swallow, eat and drink properly and, as a result, are weakened and susceptible to infections. The consequences are often fatal. In India, approximately one in 12 children with cleft dies before their first birthday.

The central treatment measure for a cleft lip and palate is surgery to close the cleft. In the project countries of Deutsche Cleft Kinderhilfe, this procedure costs an average of only 300 euros. Deutsche Cleft Kinderhilfe funds the necessary operations and follow-up therapies, giving the children the chance to live life in health and dignity. The aid concept is based on collaboration with local partners. Local doctors and therapists ensure the care of the children on site and thus guarantee sustainable help. The non-profit organization based in Freiburg is certified by the German Central Institute for Social Issues (DZI) with the DZI donation seal for the responsible and serious handling of its donation income.
